1. Go to <http://www.discoveryeducation.com>
2. Use my classroom's generic user name ( DyerStudent ) and password ( txva2013 )
3. Click on "Assignments" ( I circled it here in red for you!!!)
4. Watch the videos that I've assigned.
5. ....Please note: These videos will not be mandatory. There is no grade for doing this. However, I will promise that I will take the old videos off and put new videos on every Friday. They will correspond to the subject you are taking in the OLS Science class / Study Island assignments / Class Connects that I'm teaching.

Please remember: You do have a STAAR test in Science in 8<sup>th</sup> grade...it's a pretty tricky test. The more prepared you are in 7<sup>th</sup> grade, the easier the information will be to prepare for that test in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Besides.....who doesn't like a good science video?!? (Yes, I'm going to put a "Head Rush" video on there every Friday for you.....for fun.....cause what's the point of science if you can't have some fun with it, right?!?)
